

T. RANDALL FORTENBERY

Commodity Market Update & Outlook

Randy is professor and Thomas B. Mick Endowed Chair in the School of Economic Sciences, and Co-Director of the IMPACT Center, at Washington State University. His research focuses on agricultural markets and price performance, influence of futures trading on the stability of cash prices, and international market development, and trade.



SESSION TWO

Research Update

DR. DAVID HORN, MATT YOUNG & SUSAN BONFIELD

Dr. Horn is a Professor of Biology at Millikin University. In summer 2023, he studied how country of origin and location of sterilization influenced consumption of Nyjer® seed. The study took place for 10 weeks at three locations in and around Decatur, IL. This study is sponsored by the WBFI.



Matt Young is author of Finches of North America with Lillian Stokes and the President and Founder of the Finch Research Network (FiRN). He worked at the Cornell Lab across 15+ years where he did extensive field work for the Lab's Cerulean and Golden-winged Warblers atlas projects, and was project lead on the Lab's first Finch Irruptive Bird Survey for Bird Source in 1999. He was the Collections Management Leader/Audio Engineer at the Macaulay Library ~12 years where he edited sounds for several Merlin packs.



Susan is the Executive Director and founder of Environment for the Americas, leading international bird conservation and education efforts. With advanced degrees in natural resources and ecology, she has developed major initiatives like International Migratory Bird Day and the Western Hummingbird Partnership, and has been recognized with awards such as Wings Across the Americas for her conservation leadership.



SESSION THREE ZACH HUTCHINSON

Feedercam Frenzy Foments Fans

Zach Hutchinson is an all-around bird enthusiast that owns and operates Flocking Around, a birding and bird feeding informational site. Zach's day job is to coordinate regional science and research efforts in the largest bird conservation group in North America. Zach has a particular interest in creating digestible public communications on information learned from ornithological research.

WBFI Annual State of Birding 2025 Study

SESSION FIVE ANDREW COUTURIER

Bird Science and Conservation: Technological Advances and Community Engagement to Reverse Population Declines

Senior Science Advisor, BirdLife International, Andrew has worked extensively across Canada and internationally to conserve birds in three decades of service in the not-for-profit sector. Notable contributions include pioneering the mapping approaches used in continental conservation initiatives, leading teams to conserve IBAs and KBAs in Canada, and facilitating knowledge exchange and best practices in breeding bird atlas projects across the Americas.


